Nonresidential Building Energy Use Disclosure Program

California Energy Commission New Program Enforcement January 1, 2014

Assembly Bill 1103 (Saldaña, Chapter 533, Statutes 2007) requires a nonresidential building owner or operator to benchmark a building's energy use in advance of the sale, lease, financing or refinancing of the entire building. Starting January 1, 2014 California will require owners to disclose their building's energy use to a potential buyer, lender, or lessee.

The purpose of the program is to help raise awareness and encourage building owners find ways to increase energy efficiency and reduce consumption of energy in existing nonresidential buildings across the state of California.

The California Energy Commission is committed to help building owners successfully participate in the program. These training workshops provide information about the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager® and how to benchmark and successfully comply with the program requirements.

If you have plans to lease, sale, finance, or refinance a commercial building and the building is 10,000 sq. ft. or greater, we encourage you to attend these training workshops.
